Tip of the Month



My tip of the month deals with fly selection and which bug you should choose for certain types of water conditions. There's a rule you should always follow which goes like this...The slower the water moves, the lower your fly should sit on the water; and the flatter the profile, the better. A great example would be our Tantalizer and Emperor Caddis patterns. Notice how there is no tying material hanging below the shank of the hook which means the fly will present itself in our terms, "Belly Down." Belly Down will always be the best offering in slow moving water or lake scenarios. Next newsletter we'll talk about fly selections for fast water.
